4. First-aid measures

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7. Handling and Storage

Handling

General Handling: Avoid contact with eyes. Wash thoroughly after handling. Static electricity can accumulate on dry beads. Leave room for expansion as dry resin swells upon wetting and/or changing ionic form. Equipment construction material should be compatible with feed, regenerant, ionic form and effluent of the ion exchange process. Keep container closed. Avoid generating and breathing dust. Good housekeeping and controlling of dusts are necessary for safe handling of product.

Storage

Store in a dry place. Keep container tightly closed when not in use. Preferred storage temperature is in the lower half of the range given below.
