### **HiWay 8 Installation Instructions**


\*\*\*Important Notes\*\*\*

\*\*\* These instructions are specific for HWH landing feet that are 8" in diameter\*\*\*

\*\*\*For HiWay Plus follow these instructions for your front jacks\*\*\*

\*\*\*HiWay 8 is designed with large "bracket slots" to accommodate the spring bracket tabs on the edge of your landing foot or the cross beam between your front jacks.\*\*\*

\*\*\*GRAB A HELPER - Installation is safer and easier with 2\*\*\*





Installation time: 3 - 6 minutes per pad.

**1.** Snap Pad installation is best performed on a level or near level surface - preferably a hard surface (concrete or asphalt). Wheel chocks can be placed in front of and behind the RV wheels for additional safety.

2. \*\*\*Spread a small bead of concentrated dish soap or grease around the lip of the SnapPad to aid installation.\*\*\*

3.\*\*\*Most motorhomes will release their airbags prior to engaging the jacks. This will lower the entire RV at the beginning of the leveling process. You may place your first SnapPad prior to this, however be careful to not get caught underneath your RV during the lowering process!\*\*\*

- 4. \*\*\* Some landing feet will have the spring brackets welded to the outside lip. When lining up your SnapPad, ensure the spring brackets are inline with the brackets slots on the SnapPad. This is critical to make sure your SnapPads install properly. Certain models will have the spring brackets welded inside the lip (closer to the center). In this case the bracket slots can be aligned in any direction. \*\*\*
- \*\*\* Cross beam consideration on certain Tiffins the front jacks will have a cross beam between them. Your SnapPads may or may not hit this beam when retracted. If so, and your landing feet do not have the spring brackets welded on the lip, then you may spin your SnapPads to allow the bracket slot to line up with the cross beam. \*\*\* For other questions or clarification call technical support at 1.855.762.7723 ext. 3.
- **5.** Typically one side will level first. Take note which side that is and start there. Install one SnapPad at a time and/or use the manual jack operation if possible. Refer to your owners manual for instructions.
- **6.** Most jacks are 18" 24" under your RV. Use a tool such as a broomstick to align/adjust your SnapPads may be necessary.
- 7. Once aligned, begin lowering your jack. Keep a watchful eye on the landing foot as it extends. Stop extending when the foot is about 1 to 3 inches from the your SnapPad. Double check to make sure it is centered and (if necessary) your bracket slots are lined up with the spring brackets. Re-align as needed and then continue extending the landing gear to complete installation. \*\*\*KEEP YOUR FINGERS AND ANY FOREIGN OBJECTS CLEAR WHEN LOWERING THE JACK INTO PLACE.\*\*\*
- **8.** You should hear a distinctive 'Snap' as the lip engages. \*\*\*Visually confirm the lip is fully engaged around the perimeter of the landing foot.\*\*\*
- 9. \*\*\*If your lip hasn't fully engaged raise your jack and place a shim (small piece of wood) under the side that hasn't engaged. Lower your jack again until that side snaps into place. Search 'RV SnapPad Uneven Ground Installation' on youtube for an example.\*\*\*
- **10.** Wipe off excess soap or grease and repeat installation process, in sequence, on your remaining jacks.


### **HiWay 10 Installation Instructions**

\*\*\*Important Notes\*\*\*

\*\*\* These instructions are specific for HWH & Atwood landing feet that are 10" in diameter\*\*\*

\*\*\* For HiWay Plus use these instructions on the rear jacks\*\*\*

\*\*\*GRAB A HELPER - Installation is safer and easier with 2\*\*\*





Installation time: 3 - 6 minutes per pad.

- **1.** Snap Pad installation is best performed on a level or near level surface preferably a hard surface (concrete or asphalt). Wheel chocks can be placed in front of and behind the RV wheels for additional safety.
- 2. \*\*\*Spread a small bead of concentrated dish soap or grease around the lip of the SnapPad to aid installation.\*\*\*
- 3.\*\*\*Most motorhomes will release their airbags prior to engaging the jacks. This will lower the entire RV at the beginning of the leveling process. You may place your first SnapPad prior to this however be careful to not get caught underneath your RV during the lowering process!\*\*\*



- 4. \*\*\* Unlike HiWay 8's you have water drainage channels which can be aligned in any direction. We recommend perpendicular to your spring brackets (like in the above picture) although you can set them in any configuration\*\*\*
- **5.** Generally one side will level first, take note which side that is and start there. Install one SnapPad at a time and/or use the manual jack operation if possible. Refer to your owners manual for instructions.
- **6.** Most jacks are 18" 24" under your RV. A tool such as a broomstick to align/adjust your SnapPads may be necessary.
- 7. Once aligned begin lowering your jack. Keep a watchful eye on the landing foot as it extends. Stop extending when the foot is about 1 to 3 inches from the your SnapPad. Double check to make sure it is centered, re-align if necessary and then continue extending the landing gear to complete installation. \*\*\*KEEP YOUR FINGERS AND ANY FOREIGN OBJECTS CLEAR WHEN LOWERING THE JACK INTO PLACE.\*\*\*

- **10.** Wipe off excess soap or grease and repeat installation process, in sequence, on your remaining jacks.

- It's best (and easiest) to install your SnapPads one at a time on a level, hard surface.
- Each leveling system will have it's own manual operation function. Please refer to your owners manual for specific directions.
- Grab a helper! It's safer, faster, and more efficient with two people
- Install each SnapPad individually and visually confirm the reinforced lip has engaged on the complete diameter. It is critical your SnapPad has been installed fully and correctly.
- Standing water? No problem! Your SnapPads have a built in drainage channel.
- Installs easier in warmer weather. 50 degrees F +.



#### **SnapPad Info & Statistics**

- Once installed they add an extra 1" to your jack thickness
- You're helping our environment! SnapPads are made from American recycled tires. That means SnapPads are not only durable and versatile but environmentally
- Will work on any type of surface, level or uneven, including: Asphalt - Concrete - Grass - Gravel - Mud -Sand - Resin - Ice - Snow.


